



Last week students participated in Den Day. This activity calls on schools to join in with a creative, fun adventure as students build dens together and raise money to ensure children have a safe place to sleep and play.

The money we raised will help to make life better for vulnerable children all over the world. It will help save children's lives, and make sure they get the things they need to grow up healthy and happy, like a safe place to shelter.

- **£66** - could buy tarpaulin sheets to help provide shelter to families who have lost homes in an emergency.
- **£150** - could run two reading clubs for a year to help children in Rwanda learn literacy skills.
- **£250** - could help a family of five with life saving winter essentials including an electric radiator, a blanket, a warm jacket, hats, gloves and socks.
