On Monday a group of students delivered essential goods to Catching Lives which is an independent charity aimed at supporting the rough sleepers, homeless and vulnerably housed in Canterbury and East Kent; those who have, for many reasons, fallen through the gaps in society and feel they have nowhere else to turn. This annual visit raises student awareness of the difficulties faced by many people in our local community.

Our School Council representatives have been active this term. They have been responsible sharing the views of students within each Key Stage, and have made suggested improvements within the school.
